Our campus is located in a building near Central Kitsap High School. The school has classrooms, computers, and office areas for program support.

We offer courses in art, reading, math, science, English, social studies,

music and career/technical education. Teen parenting classes are offered to serve teen mothers and fathers, and teen parents are able to enroll their children in a daycare program.

Our school hours are 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Our school continues to help students prepare for and meet the requirements of the High School Proficiency Exams (HSPE), Smarter Balanced Testing (SBA),

With the increasing demands of student achievement testing, our program has focused on improving students' academic skills. This focus on improving student learning is reflected with improved test scores and more students meeting the standards. Our staff continues to assess their students' learning and align their training to better meet the needs of a unique student population.
