About our school

Brownsville Elementary School had its 60th Anniversary this past year. Although we are one of the oldest buildings in the district, we are leading the way in the use of technology and broader STEM curricular areas. Our educational facilities include 18 permanent classrooms, two portable classrooms, a Head Start Program, a gym/cafeteria, learning center, Learning Assistance/English as a

Second Language Programs, library, stage, and music classroom. The gym, stage and music facilities were remodeled in 1991. Our technology infrastructure is robust with each student in grade levels 2-6 having one-to-one access to a Chromebook laptop. In grades K-2, students have access to sets of interactive tablets and the teachers in these grades utilize interactive whiteboards.

Our staff continually strives to improve our practices and positively impact student improvement.
