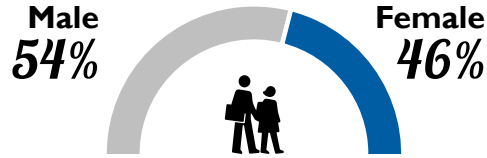

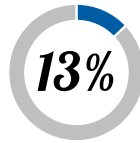

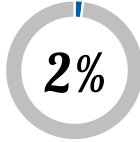

Although we are one of the oldest buildings in the district, we are leading the way in the use of technology and STEM curricular areas. Brownsville Elementary was designated as a Washington STEM Lighthouse school in 2017 and recognized with a 2016 Washington Achievement Award.

Our staff continually strives to improve our practices and positively impact student improvement.

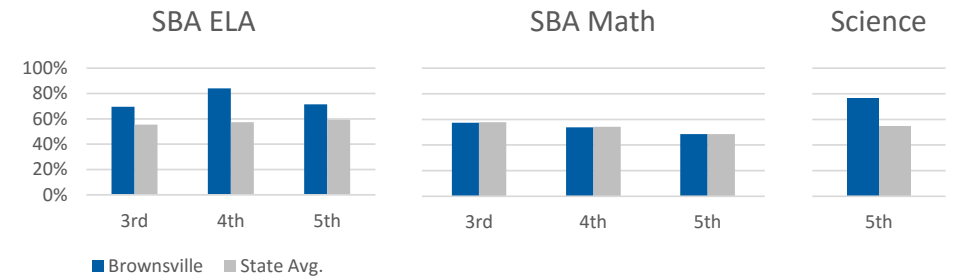
For the 2017-18 school year, our staff worked diligently to expand our science and engineering program, especially in our offerings of field trips, community partnerships, and robust curriculum.
