#### About our school

Central Kitsap High School is a fouryear comprehensive high school providing educational services to approximately 1,425 students. We are located on a forty-acre campus.

The building is open for instructional purposes Monday through Wednesday from 6:45 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and until 3:30 p.m. Thursday and Friday. The school consists of 72

classrooms. We have a well-equipped library, a 279-seat auditorium, and fully equipped science, automotive and manufacturing technology laboratories.

CK High School currently operates on a six-period day, allowing students flexibility to explore a variety of courses.



In 2015, for the thirteenth time, CKHS was awarded national recognition for being among America's most challenging high schools. We ranked sixth in the state!

### Success for all students

We use a team approach to school improvement planning. The 12-member team includes representatives from each department and subject area who meet monthly throughout the year.

Staff analyzes current data and works toward culturally responsive teaching as well. WCAP scores, SAT/ACT results, AP testing, discipline and attendance data are reviewed by staff members in small and large groups and observations and narratives are crafted to formulate goals. Our current growth initiatives focus on three major themes: improving student engagement, improving the academic performance of under-represented populations, and making significant strides in technological advancements for teaching and learning.

Good attendance is a great way to promote success in school. During the 2014-15 school year, our daily attendance rate was 83.0%.
