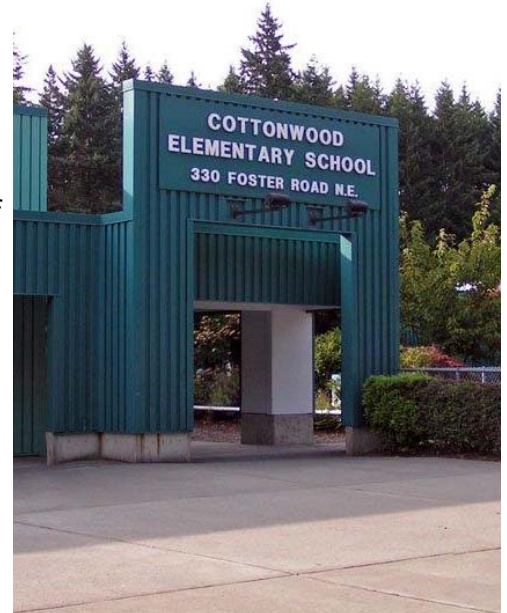
### Welcome to Cottonwood Elementary!

### About our school

Cottonwood Elementary School is typically used for instructional purposes from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Our school day begins at 9:10 a.m. The building currently houses 17 K-5 and special-education classrooms and support services including the Learning Assistance Program (LAP), Special Education resource room, music, PE, and the library. One portable classroom, adjacent to the building, is used for

daycare. This year we are also housing the Tiny Trojans Preschool.

There are a variety of activities that occur at Cottonwood Elementary outside the instructional day, including PTSA activities, community sports and classes, before and after-school daycare, clubs, tutoring and unicycling team.

### Success for all students

Our school improvement plan is designed to assess our strengths and weaknesses and then develop strategies to enhance the academic program. The ultimate goals are students meeting or exceeding standards and developing social and emotional skills that will lead them to make good decisions and take responsibility for their behavior.

As we look toward the 2017-18 school year, we will continue to evaluate our program and practices to provide the best education possible for our students. We are grateful to our families and our community who support us in this most important endeavor.
