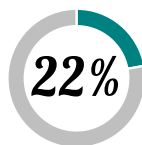

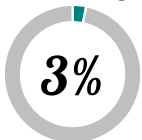

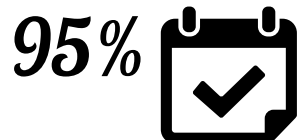

Cottonwood Elementary School is typically used for instructional purposes from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Our school day begins at 9:10 a.m. The building currently houses 17 K-5 and special education classrooms and support services including the Learning Assistance Program (LAP), Special Education resource room, music, PE, and the library. One portable classroom, adjacent to the building, is used for daycare. This year we are also housing the Tiny Trojans Preschool.

There are a variety of activities that occur at Cottonwood Elementary outside the instructional day, including PTSA activities, community sports and classes, before and after-school daycare, clubs, tutoring and unicycling team.

Success for All Students

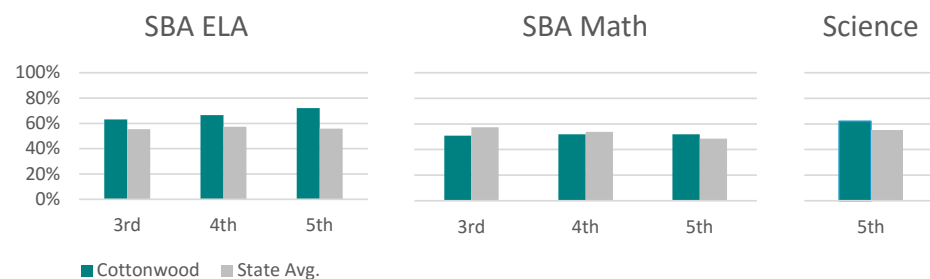
