Esquire Hills Elementary School opened in 1977. The main building is single-story, with 54,818 square feet. We have 20 classrooms with support service spaces including a gym, library, multipurpose room, music room and special education classrooms. Our staff members are committed to strong collaboration and professional development. Over the last two years, we implemented a schoolwide system of support which

includes proactive strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors. The purpose is to create a positive school environment and help our students have ownership in helping Esquire Hills be a place in which all students feel safe and are able to learn. A variety of activities occur at Esquire Hills inside and outside the instructional day.

Each fall, we review the results of the state test called the SBA, "Smarter Balanced Assessments." Students are tested in reading, writing, math and science. You may view our results online at <http://reportcard.ospi.k12.wa.us>.

We consider these results, as well as a variety of other data, to see how our students performed. From this information, we set goals and write strategies to meet these goals. This plan to improve teaching and learning is called a School Improvement Plan.

During the 2016-17 school year, our School Improvement Plan included goals

and strategies for reading, math, writing, science, behavior, diversity and technology. Staff had several opportunities to collaborate on the academic and behavioral progress students were making.

As educators, we are excited to continue growing and learning new techniques and strategies to better teach our students the skills necessary for academic and life-long success.

Good attendance is a great way to promote success in school. During the 2016-17 school year, our daily attendance rate was 93.38 percent.
