About our school

Last year we served approximately 430 students (PreK-6). Our school hosts Head Start, developmental preschool, special ed. programs, gifted services and band. Each student takes P.E., music and media specialist time as a part of our curriculum. Extended day activities include academic interventions, Math Olympiad, Choir, Destination Imagination, Unicycle Team, Safety Patrol, Drama Kids, Girls

on the Run, and Book Club. Our school day is 9:10 a.m. to 3:25 p.m. Students are dismissed at 1:55 p.m. on Thursdays so instructional staff can receive professional development, participate in data analysis teams, and plan for instruction that is aligned with our School Improvement Plan. This common planning time helps us meet the needs of each student to reach his/her full potential as a learner.

Each fall, we review the results of the state test called the MSP, "Measurement of Student Progress." Students are tested in reading, writing, math and science. We consider state testing data along with data from other formative and summative assessments, as well as family and staff survey data. This information helps staff to focus on goal areas for the school year that align with state and district learning objectives. The School

Improvement Plan is our guiding document for team and building planning. During the 2014-15 school year, our staff focused on increasing student engagement and improving reading achievement through culturally responsive strategies that maximize learning time and student potential.
