About our school

John D. “Bud” Hawk Elementary at Jackson Park is adjacent to the Bremerton Naval Hospital and The Landing at Jackson Park Navy Family Housing. Our instructional day is 8:20 a.m. to 2:35 p.m., except Thursdays when students are dismissed at 1:05 p.m. Our old building was replaced thanks to CKSD voters who approved a Capital Projects Levy in 2011.

The new Hawk Elementary at Jackson Park is a two story-building with four wings, comprising 60,836 square feet. Each of the wings contains six classrooms with shared central learning areas. The first floor houses the multi-purpose room and gym area, and the second floor houses the library. The building was completed in the summer of 2014.



John D. “Bud” Hawk Elementary at Jackson Park is located on the same site as the original school building, which was built in 1967.

Success for all students

Our staff believe that all students can learn, and we are committed to continuous improvement in the classroom. During Common Planning Time, Early Release Days, and Learning Improvement Days, classroom teachers analyze assessment data in order to identify specific strengths and weaknesses and guide improvement efforts.

In particular, we review the results of the state test called the “Smarter Balanced Assessment.” (SBA). Students are tested in reading, writing, math and science. You may view our results online at <http://reportcard.ospi.k12.wa.us>. Using

this information, teachers then focus on the specific knowledge and/or skills individual students need to learn.

As a learning community, we continue to plan effective and intentional instruction focused on the state standards. In the Extended Learning Day, teachers individualize reading and math instruction for small groups of students after school.

Good attendance is a great way to promote success in school. During the 2014-15 school year, our daily attendance rate was 92.3%.
