## About our school

Situated on an 80-acre wooded site, Klahowya Secondary School is the third and newest high school and the fourth and newest junior high school in Central Kitsap School District. Klahowya opened in 1997 and is the only secondary school in the district with enrollment in grades 7-12. Our student population is approximately 900 students.

The school has 33 classrooms, 18 portable classrooms, a gym, a common area, an auditorium with stage, a music room, a graphics room, a library, athletic fields, and support areas. Klahowya uses technology as a tool for teaching and learning with five classrooms equipped with 30 work stations.



Klahowya offers a "seamless" curriculum, encouraging students to select courses in their Personal Education Plan (PEP) across all grade levels and academic areas.
