New Frontiers Secondary School is a self-contained alternative program. It is designed to primarily help students in grade 9 reach their academic goals by offering an alternative format in both presentation of learning material and documentation of time spent on school activities.

Our primary goal is to assist students in completing grade level

requirements so they can advance to one of the district's high schools.

Established in 1989, New Frontiers is a portable classroom with a capacity of approximately sixty students.

School hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.



New Frontiers is located just off Anderson Hill Road on Frontier Place and is adjacent to Central Kitsap Junior High and the district transportation building.

New Frontiers is continually adjusting, enhancing and making additions to the courses and services we offer students. After analyzing information gathered from assessments and standardized test results, we add courses and lessons to enhance performance areas in need of improvement, including reading, writing and math. We also add services to help students overcome situations that have had a negative influence on their academic success.

Our school continues to help students prepare for and meet the requirements of the High School Proficiency Exams (HSPE), Smarter Balanced Testing (SBA),

and End of Course math and science exams (EOC). Our goal is to help students learn strategies to be successful on the HSPE/SBA/EOC in reading, writing, math and science.

With the increasing demands of student achievement testing, our program has focused on improving students' academic skills. This focus on improving student learning is reflected with improved test scores and more students meeting the standards. Our staff continues to assess their students' learning and align their training to better meet the needs of a unique student population.
