About our school

Olympic High School is home to a diverse student body of approximately 1,100 students in grades 9 through 12. We opened in September of 1979 and is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission.

Olympic currently operates on a six-period day and offers a wide variety of courses to serve our students' needs. We offer a modified schedule two

days per week to accommodate a 47 minute Advisory or Tutorial period each of those days.

Our school has 48 classrooms, two gyms, band and choir rooms, library, auto shop, art and graphic arts rooms. In addition, there are four portable classrooms.

Success for all students

Our School Improvement Plan is focused on increasing the percentage of students meeting state standards. While percentages change from year to year based upon student cohorts and revisions to the test, we continue our work ensuring students learn the state standards and can demonstrate their proficiency. Our Advanced Placement (AP) and honors programs raise standards in all classes to ensure students have a rigorous course of study. Many students are taking AP classes and exams to earn

college credit. Enrollment in AP courses and the percentage of students taking the AP exam increased significantly. Our honors program provides challenging opportunities for sophomores.

Our school programs provide students a full range of quality learning experiences inside and outside the classroom. We also provide guidance, academic support time, and assistance for our students during the school day.

Good attendance is a great way to promote success in school. During the 2014-15 school year, our daily attendance rate was 86.0%.
