AskBYS.org follow up

Tim has arranged for AskBYS to come talk to the next monthly West Sound Counselor meeting so they can learn about the resources available for students.

The nurses have received posters from AskBYS that the middle school and high school nurses have asked permission to put in their schools. There are tear-off slips on the posters with contact information so students can take the information with them.

GirlsHealth.gov is a national website that has other resources for girls to access. It has information on fitness, nutrition, bullying, relationships, etc. and is geared toward older elementary students as well as middle and high school students. Vonnie will email AskBYS if they might include a link to GirlsHealth.gov on their website.

Review updated medication forms and parent letters

Revised medication forms and parent letter were reviewed with a few changes suggested. Diane will make those revisions and the new forms will be used for the next school year.

NBK upcoming Kindergarten fair Jan. and Feb.

Heather said that there will be two kindergarten fairs next year, the first on Tuesday January 26th at Bangor and the second on Monday February 8th at the Jackson Park Chapel. Both will take place from 3 to 6pm and will have representatives from Head Start and the regional library as well as the principals from Clear Creek and Cougar Valley Elementary schools. Jenni would like a table for the Naval Hospital as well.

Vonnie will send Heather the email addresses for the North Kitsap, South Kitsap and Bremerton nurses so she can see if they would like to participate. The Central Kitsap nurses will have a table as in the past and will hand out information about required immunizations, life-threatening conditions and when to keep kids home from school.

District-wide immunization status reporting to DOH

Attached is the immunization status report that Vonnie prepared for the Department of Health that was due on November 1st. The goal for herd immunity is 95%, which a majority of our schools have achieved or are close to achieving. Some of the middle schools are having trouble complying with the new varicella requirement for 8th graders. Next year two doses of varicella will be required for all grades. Sara Leshley has already started looking at CK High School and there are around 200 students who will need a varicella shot.

Vonnie creates reports monthly for each school on students out of compliance which helps for tracking purposes and follow up.

Other business

- The 5210 Toolkit that was on the old website got lost in the transition to the new site. Angela Dice will put it back within the next few weeks.
- After an edible marijuana incident at Klahowya where students were made violently ill it was suggested that the nurses present information to staff as to what edible marijuana looks like today and its effects.
- Vonnie presented Becky with a mercury thermometer for disposal that was found at West Alt High in a first-aid package.
- Becky said that janitors have been instructed to step up their touch point sanitizing in anticipation of cold and flu season.
- Vonnie spoke with the Costco pharmacist and learned that flu vaccine is ordered in July and arrives in August so would be available for the Benefits Fair. Jenni is in charge of the flu shot clinic at Bangor where they give shots to thousands and can let us know the date next year.
