Adolescent Oral Health Screening

Dental screening took place at Fairview Middle School and New Frontiers on September 9th. At Fairview it was in conjunction with vision and hearing screening, with students going from station to station.

We would like to screen at other middle schools if possible since we are in a poor dental health area.

Staff Flu Shot Clinics

Rite Aid contacted principals about the possibility of having flu shot clinics for staff members. Clear Creek had theirs on September 10th and 15 people participated. The following schools are scheduled to have clinics:

- Olympic High School and Fairview Middle School – October 8th
- CK High School-October 15th
- Ridgetop Middle School and Silverdale- October 22nd

A minimum of 15 people have to sign up in order to make it worthwhile – the clinic at Brownsville was cancelled because only 1 person signed up. Rite Aid will bill insurance, but doesn't accept Group Health. Any department personnel can attend any scheduled clinic as long as they sign up. Vonnie will contact Kattie Nepper at Transportation to see if they are interested in setting up a clinic for the bus drivers.

Field Trip Planning

Vonnie attended the second Department Resource Meeting and covered medication delegation and field trips with the office staff in attendance. Olympic High School has an overnight field trip this weekend that was just approved this week where the teacher said he was not sure who would be attending until they showed up the

morning of the trip, which makes it difficult or impossible to plan for medication training. It is an ongoing issue that will have to be continued to be addressed.

Becky said that Bremerton school district has field trip forms that have a sign off area for the doctor if they allow the student to self-carry their medication that she will send to us.

Immunization Update

There are currently 25 6th grade students out of compliance for Tdap in the district. Two exclusion packets have been sent so far. For the varicella requirement at the middle schools there are 14 out of compliance. Vonnie sends the lists to office staff and school principals with a phone script for follow up calls.

Next year all students through 12th grade will be required to have two varicella shots. Letters will go out in the spring to all 9th, 10th and 11th graders who need additional shots to be in compliance for the 2016-17 school year.

Medication at School

There have been instances this year of students bringing in medications with no orders and students bringing in their own medications. Some parents were unaware that new medication orders are required for every school year regardless of how late in the school year they were prescribed.

Chris would like the end of year letter that is sent to parents whose students have medications at school reviewed to ensure that it states that new orders are needed each school year. Vonnie will send Jill Carlson a copy of that letter.

Chris had a question about students who self- carry medications and would like to make sure a letter is sent to them at the end of the year.

Because of an incident at Cottonwood it was determined by principals that they can use their judgement to administer medication to a student who has no current medication orders on file.

The Confidential Health Information Form has not been sent out annually by Cottonwood. It has been included in their new student packets but they were not aware that it should go out to all students every year. They will be sending it out in the next few weeks.

Other Topics

Sam said that OSPI has applied for a Child Nutrition grant that would allow for a state wide free and reduced lunch application system which would make the application process easier for everyone.

Heather said that there could be benefits for students if they are enrolled in the free and reduced program as they could be eligible for grants and scholarships.

Heather also mentioned a Military Student Identifier that could be available in 2016 that would provide valuable information as to how military students as a group are performing.

She will send us a link to a Virginia Beach schools presenter that had very good information.
