

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

General Information

History: The Central Kitsap District was reorganized as such on October 28, 1941, by public vote held in the area under the provisions of the school district reorganized act of the Washington State Legislature, 1941. The third-class districts which were merged into the new district were as follows:

The Union High School No. 6 was thus brought into the new district intact and became Central Kitsap High School. The old building was destroyed by a controlled burn in April 1975. In its place a parking lot was constructed.

The location of the Central Kitsap School District is in the central part of Kitsap County lying north of Bremerton and south of North Kitsap (Poulsbo) districts. It comprises about 110 square miles of territory lying between Puget Sound on the east and Hood Canal on the west. In 1983, 105 acres were transferred from the North Kitsap School District to the Central Kitsap School District in the unpopulated area on Bucklin Hill.

Current director districts and their boundaries are listed in Policy 1105.

The Central Kitsap School District became a district of the first class on July 1, 1953.

The 1980 census indicated a District population of approximately 41,500.
